THE ORAL HEALTH OF ADULTS LIVING IN MISSOURI'S SKILLED NURSING FACILITIES



Residents aged 37-100 years (mean=75)

22 Skilled nursing facilities

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Expand programs that provide educational and preventive dental services at skilled nursing facilities.
- Develop programs that provide corrective and emergency dental services at skilled nursing facilities.
- Provide enhanced training to nursing facility staff about the importance of daily oral hygiene services.
- Create a referral system between skilled nursing facilities and safety-net dental clinics for residents with urgent dental needs.
- Consider the use of silver diamine fluoride treatment by public health hygienists for patients with transportation barriers.

38% The percentage of residents with no patural teath


TOOTH DECAY AND GUM DISEASE CAN CAUSE PAIN AND LIFE-THREATENING INFECTIONS



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

DENTAL MEDICAID REMUNERATION FEE SCHEDULE HAS INCREASED FROM 38% TO 80% OF UCR



ADULT EXPANSION ENROLLEES AT A 10% UTILIZATION: 17,000

LONG TERM HEALTH CARE FACILITIES AT 20% UTILIZATION MAY INCREASE UTILIZATION BY 12,000

HIGH RISK CHILDREN FROM K THROUGH 8TH GRADE AT AT 20% UTILIZATION INCREASE OF 48,000

INCREASED CARE LOAD IS A TOTAL OF 77,000


