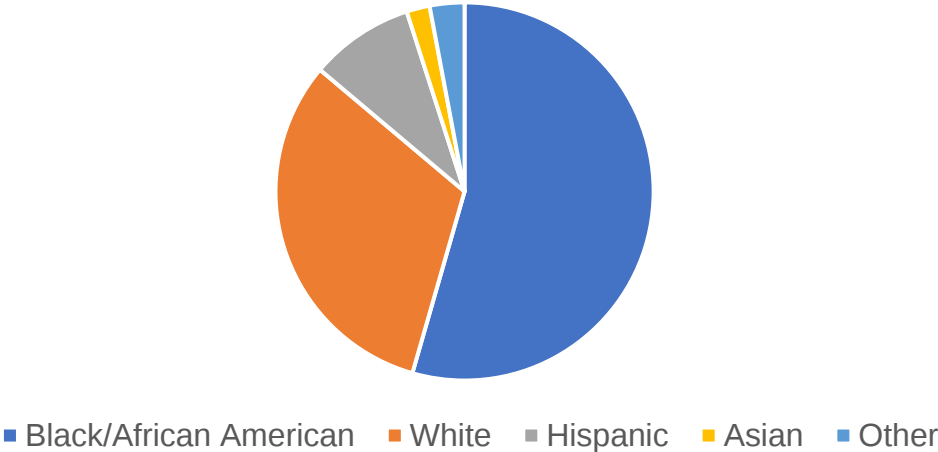

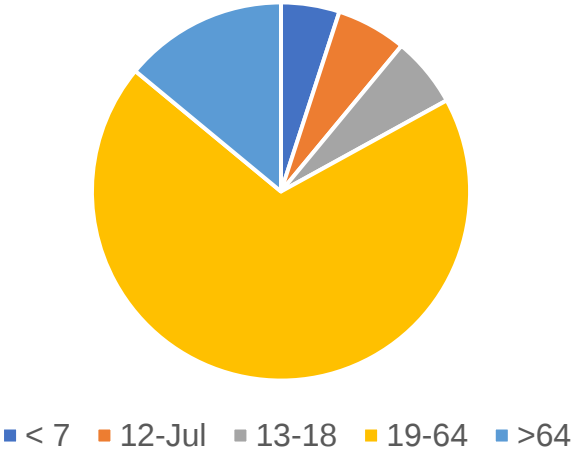
- 79,000 Sq foot facility

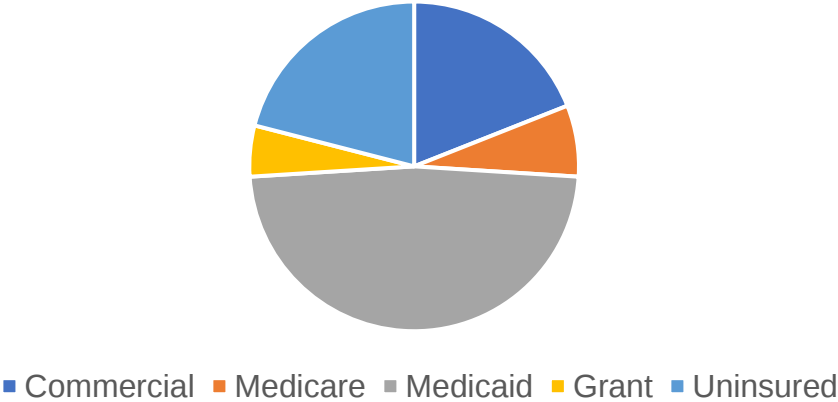

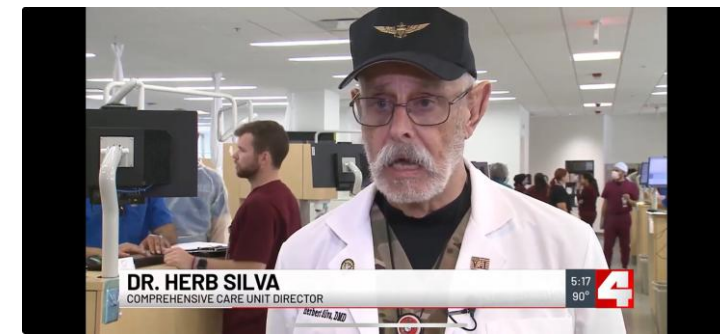

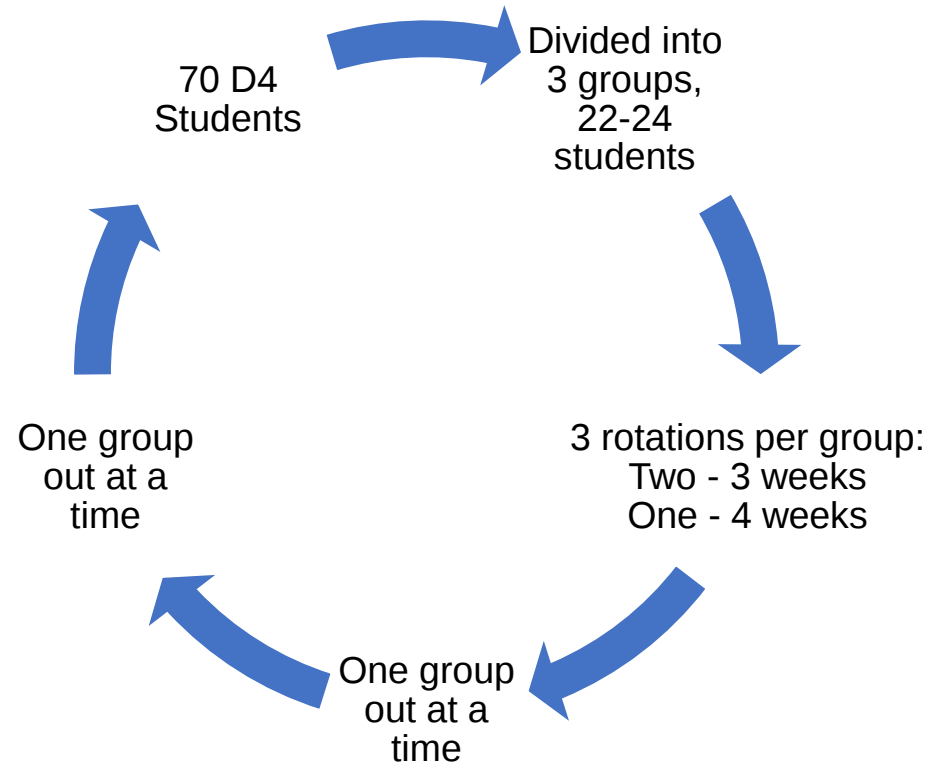
